- *Children with chronic, complicated health conditions*
- *Children who are affected by a combination of health and other factors (social, financial, or cultural forces)*
- *Youth and young adults moving towards adult health care and more independence*

What does shared care planning look like?

- *Families and professionals come to a shared care planning meeting (in real time)*
- *Medications are reviewed*
- *Treatment options are clarified and questions answered*
- *They talk together about family strengths, resources, and challenges the child may be facing*

VIRTUAL CARE TEAM CONFERENCE

“VCTC”

This is the same as a face to face meeting but you don't have to be in the same room. Using teleconferencing technology to connect the patient, primary care provider and sub-specialty physicians the care team will come together to develop a plan of care.

Connect to the conference by smart phone, tablet or computer. All you need to have is a camera on your device and access to internet.

Your Part

- *Provide your contact information to the coordinator*
- *Make yourself available to participate in the conference*
- *Download “Zoom” on your device*
- *Document a short note in your EMR*

Children with medical complexity often have several physicians taking care of them. A multidisciplinary patient care conference is a meeting where some or all of a patient's doctors get together to discuss the overall plan of care for the patient. The care team is made up of the:

- *Patient and family*
- *Primary care provider/Pediatrician*
- *Sub-specialty doctors*
- *Hospital physicians*
- *Care coordinator*
- *Discharge planner (if indicated)*
- *Family advocates (if needed)*
- *Therapists (if needed)*
